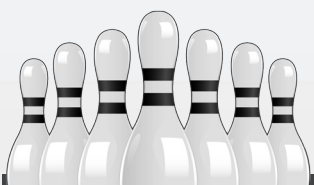

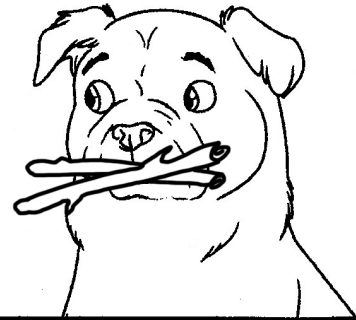
STewardShip JACK & Friends
